

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Executive Summary



2024 was a year of growth, impact, and resilience for CSC-Asbl. Highlights include:

3,724 lives impacted through trauma healing, education, and empowerment programs.

EmpowerHer: Supported 50 women with leadership and entrepreneurship training.

Environmental Sustainability: Planted 100 trees and trained 50 women in sustainable farming practices.



Community support flourished during World Table Tennis Day, which brought together 957 participants, fostering inclusion and visibility in Kitundu Internal Displaced Persons Camp (IDP) in Uvira



Our annual Community Support Center Day drew over 1,300 participants, with coverage from local radio and television, amplifying our mission.




Strengthened partnerships with key stakeholders and joined impactful networks to amplify our reach.

• Play4Peace and Mental Health Support (P4PM): Breaking Barriers Through Sports

The Play4Peace program fosters mental health, social cohesion, and gender equality by engaging children and youth in inclusive sports and play-based activities. In 2024, 250 participants joined the program, with girls' participation increasing from 10% to an inspiring 38%. This milestone is a testament to our vision of breaking entrenched gender stereotypes and creating a future where every child has a voice on and off the field.

• Trauma Therapy: Healing Hearts, Restoring Hope

Through trauma therapy, CSC-Asbl provides safe spaces for women and children to process conflict-induced trauma. In 2024, countless lives were transformed as participants reported significant emotional resilience and renewed hope for the future. This work is at the heart of our mission to empower survivors to rebuild their lives and communities.

2. Mitigating Global Warming through Environmental Management

Through the Seed the Future and PAFA projects, CSC-Asbl empowers women in Uvira to embrace sustainable agriculture and environmental restoration. In 2024, we supported 50 women in Kitundu Camp, guiding them to adopt resilient farming practices. Additionally, 47 women farmers in Kawizi received ongoing agricultural advice. As part of the Seed the Future pilot project, supported by Wood U Waste, 100 fruit trees were planted, creating microclimates, reducing hunger, and fostering sustainable development.

This year, 50 young girls from Kitundu International Displaced Persons Camp participated in EmpowerHer workshops. They received training in leadership, entrepreneurship, and life skills. Testimonials revealed increased self-confidence and a renewed sense of opportunity, enabling these girls to envision brighter futures.

• Education Support: Enabling Dreams


We provided 60 children from Kitundu Camp with school kits and funded 20 scholarships for displaced children in Itombwe, in partnership with local schools. Despite aiming to support over 250 children annually, financial constraints remain a challenge. These efforts were made possible through the generous support of Quakers in France and the USA.


Community Support Center Day







2024 Funding Utilization & Call for Partnership

At the Community Support Center (CSC-Asbl), we believe that even the smallest contribution can spark lasting change. In 2024, we effectively allocated our funding of \$19,000.

Only 4% covered administrative execution to keep operations running efficiently.

However, our biggest challenge remains financial sustainability. Despite our impact, our team works as volunteers due to limited funding. Without long-term donors and partners we struggle to expand lifechanging programs for vulnerable women and children.




